

**BY-LAW NUMBER 91-27  
OF THE  
CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UXBRIDGE**

**BEING A BY-LAW TO PROHIBIT THE THROWING, PLACING  
OR DEPOSITING OF REFUSE OR DEBRIS ON PROPERTY OF THE  
MUNICIPALITY**

---

**WHEREAS** the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302, section 210 (76) and amendments thereto allows municipalities to pass by-laws for "prohibiting the throwing, placing or depositing of refuse or debris on private property or on property of the municipality or any local board thereof without the authority from the owner or occupant of such property";

**AND WHEREAS** it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Township of Uxbridge to prohibit the throwing, placing or depositing of refuse or debris on property of the municipality or any local board thereof.

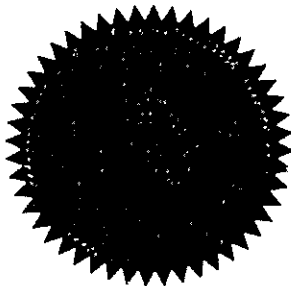
**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Uxbridge enacts as follows:


1. In the by-law
  - (a) "township" means Township of Uxbridge;
  - (b) "refuse" or "debris" shall include but shall not be limited to domestic waste and garbage and animal waste;
  - (c) "property of the municipality" shall include all municipal parkland, all municipal roadways and all other properties owned or leased by the municipality of the Township of Uxbridge.
2. No person shall throw, place or deposit refuse or debris on any property of the municipality, except in containers provided for that purpose.
3. A person having a domestic animal under their control shall forthwith upon deposit by the animal of waste on property of the municipality remove the said waste from the property of the municipality.


Every person who contravenes any provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a penalty of not more than \$5,000.00, pursuant to and recoverable under the **Provincial Offences Act**, R.S.O. 1980, c. 400, as amended from time to time.

5. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on its passing.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD time and finally passed this 25th day of February, 1991.
